## Other important safety notes:

- **Insurance**: This venue has public-liability cover.
- **First aid:** Public contact Wildlife officers at Daisy Hill Koala Centre are trained in first-aid. There is a first aid kit and AED on site but it is recommended that group leaders also carry their own first aid kit while visiting Daisy Hill Koala Centre and Daisy Hill Conservation Park.
- Evacuation plans: Daisy Hill Koala Centre has an emergency evacuation plan in place. A site map and evacuation plan are displayed on the wall of all exits and can be made available upon request. The designated emergency evacuation area is car park 1.
- Class supervision: Supervision of students/groups is the responsibility of the attending teacher/group leader. Please take responsibility for ensuring that your students/groups adhere to the advice provided by the Wildlife Officer.
- Headcounts. Group leaders must ensure that they know where participants are at all times and what they are doing. Group leaders must conduct regular headcounts.
